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**TEA POT WITH "HAUSMALER" CHINOISERIE DECORATION**

Meissen, ca. 1723-24. \*CONDITION: minor chip to tip of spout

After a "Böttger" stoneware model. Painted with a circumferential Chinese garden landscape featuring two tall Chinese figures. The edges with gold rims. The cover, likewise with a chinoiserie scene. Underglaze blue swords and K.P.M (Royal Porcelain Manufactory).
